

## SNOW CUBS ANNUAL REMINDERS TO SNOWMOBILERS:

• Per Ordinance: No person shall operate a snowmobile on any sidewalk, pedestrian way or area between the sidewalk and curb line of any street in the Village except to obtain access to an authorized area.

 Snowmobiles are able to use the north side of Bowen Street from the railroad tracks east to the Brandon Store and Lockin Street to access the Depot Park.

No person shall use a driveway marked with an orange flag.
