are held the 2nd Monday of each month and are open to the public. The Utility meeting begins at 7:00 pm with the regular meeting immediately after.



# Winter Reminders

- Within 24 hours of sleet & snowfall, it is the duty of the homeowner or occupant to <u>clear the sidewalks</u>. Failure to comply may result in a local ordinance citation.
- It is prohibited to blow snow into the street when clearing a driveway or sidewalk.
- To allow for the Department of Public works to clear snow from roads, no parking on streets from 2 am—6 am.

## SNOW CUB SNOWMOBILE REMINDERS:



- ⇒ No person shall operate a snowmobile on any sidewalk, pedestrian way or area between the sidewalk and curb line of any street in the Village except to obtain access to an authorized area.
- ⇒ Snowmobiles are able to use the north side of Bowen Street from the railroad tracks east to the Brandon Store and Lockin Street to access the Depot Park. No person shall use a driveway marked with an orange flag.
